Infant & Toddler

Welcome back! Hope everyone had a great holiday season and enjoyed their break. We all look forward to another year of watching your little ones learn and grow. We would like thank all the families that brought special snacks to share at our holiday celebration as well as the very generous teacher gifts we received.

As you know, the Montessori Method is the basis of our teaching philosophy here at A Caring Place. Here are some examples of how we incorporate the method within the Infant and Toddler Programs:

Order- Children have a strong need for consistency and repletion, as well as a love for routines. They also show a need for order in their environment- needing to have a certain place for everything. Examples of this at school are: job placement on low accessible shelves, and a daily schedule/routine.

Movement- Children are working on gaining control and coordination. Grasping, touching, balancing, crawling, and walking. Examples of this at school are: classroom arrangement of furniture, freedom to move indoors and outdoors, and equipment for fine and gross motor development.

Refinement of senses- Fascination with sensorial experiences: taste, sound, touch, and smell. Examples of this at school are: buggy walks, art projects, and water play.

Language- Use of words to communicate. Babble turns into words, phrases, and then sentences. Vocabulary and comprehension are continuously expanding. Examples of this at school are: reading books, singing songs, and talking through daily tasks.

Music- Interest in and development of pitch, rhythm, and melody. Examples of this at school are : singing songs, dancing to music, playing with certain instruments, and playing soft music at nap time.
